





MANAS which stands for "Mental Health and Normalcy Augmentation System" was endorsed as a national program by the Prime Minister's Science, Technology, and Innovation Advisory Council (PM-STIAC). MANAS is based on life skills and core psychological processes delivering age-appropriate methods for all age groups from 0-70 years.

An app initially targeting 15-35 years was virtually launched by Prof. K. Vijay Raghavan, Former Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India (PSA), on April 13, 2021.



The app integrates the health and wellness efforts of various government ministries, and scientifically validated indigenous tools with gamified interfaces developed/researched by various national bodies and research institutions.


